Part 3 CONTRACTOR'S PROPOSALS

- The following clauses define the type and detail of information that is required to be submitted as part of the Contractor's tender. The sum total of this information will form the Contractor's Proposals.
- The Contractor's Proposals shall comply with all the provisions of the Employer's Requirements. The Contractor shall incorporate such further specifications, general matters, detail drawings and calculations as are necessary to fully describe the Works and the standards to which the same shall be designed and constructed.
- Where the Contractor has incorporated such further provisions, these shall be to no less a standard of design, workmanship and materials than is contained in these Employer's Requirements or reasonably to be inferred therefrom and the Contractor shall confirm this in his tender submission.
- Any divergence between the Employer's Requirements and the Contractor's Proposals shall be resolved in the manner laid down in the Conditions of Contract.
- The Contract Sum Analysis is to be appended to the Contractor's Proposals in the format set out in the Employer's Requirements. Notwithstanding the descriptions and computations contained in the Analysis the Tender Sum shall be deemed to fully cover the carrying out and completion of the design, execution and commissioning of the works and setting to work.
- The Contractor must provide statements with his tender which shall substantiate his proposals in particular provide the following information:

Details of specification of materials and workmanship to be used in the construction of the individual elements of the development where these are in addition to those contained in the Employer's Requirements.

Details of any proposed sub-contractors and specialist suppliers.

Completed Contract Sum Analysis.

Quality Criteria Responses.

Certain Method Statements

CDM information

Schedule of key dates
