

Local Authority Prevent incident response and activity monitor

Version 4 – 20/06/2017 – 16.00

Overview:

Following Monday's attack on Seven Sisters Road, monitoring of tensions, concerns, and engagement by Prevent teams across the London Network has been activated. Prevent practitioners are liaising with Police and London Resilience colleagues, community partners, and faith institutions. Open communication will allow the network to co-ordinate our response, share information, and issue messages of reassurance to community members. Community members have been encouraged to feedback any concerns and community tensions to ensure policing and local authority responses are proportionate and tailored to reflect local need. The below information provides a summary and breakdown of responses and actions taken by Prevent teams, the local authorities, and police colleagues.

Summary:

Monday 19 June 2017, shortly before 00:20, a van drove into a group of worshippers on the pavement outside the Muslim Welfare House on Seven Sisters Road. Police and emergency services were called on site and a cordon was set up by around the area. It has been confirmed that a man has been arrested. At the time of writing, one fatality has been confirmed. The Home Secretary subsequently issued a statement in which she confirmed that the attack is being treated "as a terrorist incident". Following her attendance of a COBRA meeting, the Prime Minister issued a statement in which she reiterated that this attack is considered a terrorist attack and described it as "sickening". The man arrested on suspicion of carrying out the attack has been named as Darren Osborne and was not known to the security services.

Overall assessment:

Heightened concerns by the Muslim community have been noted across the vast majority of boroughs, notably considering this threat coincides with the last 10 days of Ramadan. Reassurance messaging and calls for concerns to be shared and reported have been undertaken by Prevent and Police colleagues across boroughs. Engagement with local community and faith groups is also ongoing throughout several London boroughs. Communication with statutory partners, and especially within the education sector, is also ongoing. In some instances, certain faith groups and organisations have requested increased an increased police presence. A number of community and faith groups have issued statements expressing horror at the attack and calling for unity in the wake of this tragedy. Although hate crime figures for 19/06/2017 are not yet available, incidents have been reported in some boroughs.

1. To establish effective engagement with partners and the community within London
2. To forge a joined up working approach with MPS
3. To ensure consistent situational awareness
4. To identify mitigating actions to be undertaken by Local Authorities
5. To ensure effective monitoring of the developing situation and timely sharing of information

- Boroughs and Police to continue to monitor tensions and assessing local and London wide sentiment.

- Ensure Prevent is incorporated into borough level discussions on the incident
