# Local Authority Prevent incident response and activity monitor

Version 2 – 19/06/2017 – 16.00

#### Overview:

Following today's attack on Seven Sisters Road, monitoring of tensions, concerns, and engagement by Prevent teams across the London Network has been activated. Prevent practitioners are liaising with Police and London Resilience colleagues, community partners, and faith institutions. Open communication will allow the network to co-ordinate our response, share information, and issue messages of reassurance to community members. Community members have been encouraged to feedback any concerns and community tensions to ensure policing and local authority responses are proportionate and tailored to reflect local need. The below information provides a summary and breakdown of responses and actions taken by Prevent teams, the local authorities, and police colleagues.

#### Summary:

Monday 19 June 2017, shortly before 00:20, a van drove into a group of worshippers on the pavement outside the Muslim Welfare House on Seven Sisters Road. Police and emergency services were called on site and a cordon was set up by around the area. It has been confirmed that a man has been arrested. At the time of writing, one fatality has been confirmed. The Home Secretary subsequently issued a statement in which she confirmed that the attack is being treated "as a terrorist incident". Following her attendance of a COBRa meeting, the Prime Minister issued a statement in which she reiterated that this attack is considered a terrorist attack and described it as being "sickening".

#### Overall assessment:

While no community tension incidents have yet been reported in the wake of the attack, heightened concerns by the Muslim community have been noted across the vast majority of boroughs. Reassurance messaging and calls for concerns to be shared and reported have been undertaken by Prevent and Police colleagues across most boroughs. Engagement with local community and faith groups is also ongoing throughout several London boroughs. Communication with statutory partners, and especially within the education sector, is also ongoing. In some instances, certain faith groups and organisations have requested increased an increased police presence. A number of community and faith groups have issued statements expressing horror at the attack and calling for unity in the wake of this tragedy.

- 4. To identify mitigating actions to be undertaken by Local Authorities
- 5. To ensure effective monitoring of the developing situation and timely sharing of information

We met to remember Jo Cox, to honour and celebrate her affirmation that we all have more in common than we have things which differentiate us. We met to celebrate our friendship and our cooperation for the good of our neighbourhood. Less than 48 hours later this same area experienced a terrorist attack aimed at killing Muslims returning home after their Ramadan prayers. Our thoughts and prayers are with the family of the person who died and with all those injured and traumatised by this event. The communities at the Muslim Welfare House and Finsbury Park Mosque are a valued part of the Islington Faiths Forum. These faith sites and communities are places of welcome. They are our friends. We pray especially for the leaders of these two communities. May we and they continue to stand together in these challenging times."

15:18 - Cllr Richard Watts, Leader of Islington Council, said: "The heartfelt thoughts of everyone at Islington Council are with the family and friends of those affected by the dreadful events in Finsbury Park in the early hours of this morning. Police have stated it is a rumour. There was one person and they are not looking for anyone else in connection with this. 15:18 - Confirmation during Gold meeting that the police response was immediate and not delayed as reported. They had responded to local women via the Prevent co-ordinator saying they were afraid travelling from the mosque at night since Ramadan started. So had responded by putting on extra patrols to enable the community to see a police presence in the area at that time each day. They were patrolling in the area minutes after the attack and were able to respond. 15:18 - A local rest centre for families was opened by Islington in the early hours to support families who were unable to get to their home because of the incident and also were not allowed to pass through the cordoned off area. 15:18 - The Prime Minister, The Mayor, the leader of the council and Jeremy Corbin all met at the Mosque where the crowd had gathered earlier. A number are injured and there has been one confirmed death, although at this stage it is unclear as to whether that death is related to the incident or to a pre-existing medical condition. In any case our thoughts and prayers remain with those caught up in the events of last night outside Muslim Welfare House in Finsbury Park.

Over the last few weeks we have seen communities across the country come together and stand united in the face of these terrible incidents. Communities, diverse in their faiths and beliefs, but united in their opposition to injustice and division, resolute in standing against those forces, be it the so called Islamic State or the far-right, who seek to divide us all, and sow the seeds of fear and disunity.
