Dear Councillors,

The deadline for receipt of motions for Council on 4 December is noon on Tuesday 26 November.

You will recall that the following motions have already been submitted by the Labour Group:

1. "In view of anecdotal evidence of an increase in rickets amongst the borough's school children and the recent report Our Children Deserve Better, Prevention Pays from the Chief Medical Officer Prof. Dame Sally Davies, this Council resolves as part of its new public health remit and jointly with the local NHS to undertake a study to identify the incidence of rickets within the borough. It will then present the evidence to all local schools, nurseries and children's centres to encourage them to introduce measures such as the restoration of free, vitamin enhanced milk and other drinks for all pupils and supplements for pregnant women and those who intend to become pregnant, to tackle this growing problem."

2. "Despite the work carried out in the Royal Borough over the last ten years to reduce child and pedestrian road casualties, cyclists' deaths and serious injuries are continuing to rise, and collisions involving motorcyclists and pedestrians are declining only slowly. Pedestrians, cyclists and

motorcyclists make up the vast majority of the road deaths and serious injuries in the Borough. In the case of pedestrians, it is the elderly, people with disabilities, the infirm and children who are most at risk from speeding traffic, inconsiderate driving, including drivers who do not respect zebra crossings.

The Borough has already introduced a 20mph speed limit on Exhibition Road, but has so far refused to join the 26 other London Boroughs who have either implemented or are planning to implement 20mph limits on 351 London streets, squares and areas as an additional tool to reduce casualties and to create an environment that encourages active travel and improved health through walking and cycling.

The Council therefore resolves to encourage 20mph speed limits on streets and areas in the Borough, as an additional road safety tool, at the request of local residents complaining, for example, about accidents in their area, about speeding traffic, or where residents and their associations want to include slower traffic speeds as part of an area improvement plan."

3. "This Council resolves to undertake a review of its insurance policies in view of recent events, including the power surges at Grenfell Tower, this year's inflation-busting premiums required from TMO leaseholders, the damaged car in Colville Square and residents injured on York stone paving with a view to making the process whereby insurance is purchased more transparent and amenable to resident input and to make it simpler for residents who have suffered loss or damage to claim against them. This Council will also ask the major registered housing providers operating within the borough to do likewise."
