Thank you for coming to visit RPT yesterday, we were together meeting with Eddie, a Grenfell Tower resident first thing.

In the meeting you gave the impression that your priority would be to get someone in charge in place as a matter of priority, and act in a co-ordinating capacity.

As it stands, there are a number of local groups mainly staffed by volunteers working 24/7 trying to deal with this disaster, there is no central co-ordinated point of contact for information or residents needs.

The government needs to appoint a minister/ department & team in charge immediately to co-ordinate all the different relief efforts.

Most of the people on the ground are volunteers, or community based operations, and most of us do not have disaster experience or training, there has been no lead on this.

Very urgently - no one has been visiting the hotels to check the residents - some are elderly, all are very disorientated and most do not have English as a first language.

For example just now a RPT volunteer had to drive a doctor from the Westway to one of the hotels. Grief counsellors and medics need to be at the hotels on a daily basis.

In addition you said you would find out why nothing has been heard from the CEO of the RBKC - Nicholas Holgate - where is he?

I look forward to hearing from you today. thank you Sof McVeigh



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
