- Demonstrate the ability to act in accordance with the statutory duties placed upon fire and rescue authorities when authorised by them to discharge that duty.
- Demonstrate the ability to gather and confirm information relevant to the incident, known and anticipated risks to people, property, communities and the environment.
- Demonstrate the ability to prioritise objectives, plan and implement actions to resolve the incident.
- Demonstrate the ability to identify, implement and monitor effective risk control measures and safe systems of work to resolve the incident.
- Demonstrate the ability to meet changing incident priorities by adapting the incident plan to meet those need(s) whilst maintaining effective risk control measures and safe systems of work.
- Demonstrate the ability to implement an effective incident command structure commensurate with the command, safety, communication and resourcing needs for incident resolution.
- Demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively with those directly involved and those who are supporting incident resolution.
- Demonstrate the ability to effectively monitor and evaluate the incident and the incident plan to confirm progress made to that
 expected. Adapting the incident plan as considered necessary whilst maintaining effective risk control measures and safe systems of work.
- Demonstrate the ability to take immediate and decisive action(s) to deal with risk critical issues that are not being addressed as
 part of the incident plan.
- Demonstrate the ability to review and determine incident status and to monitor and support the incident commander to resolve the incident.
- Demonstrate the ability to take over command of the incident in accordance with brigade policy
- Demonstrate the ability to collect and record information on personal performance and or service delivery in support of the brigade debrief and performance monitoring processes and policy.

Incident scenario (To be developed in conjunction with LFB SMA)

Tyler House is a high rise block of residential flats (constructed in approximately 1973) which is situated in the London Borough of Newham, East London.

The building consists of sixteen floors (ground and floors 1-15) and is approximately 80 metres x 20 metres. There are 140 dwellings, ten flats on each floor from ground to 14th floor level and four penthouse flats at 15th floor level.

The building is undergoing remedial works to replace external windows and ventilation ducting to all dwellings. External scaffolding is erected to the front face of the building from ground to fifteenth floor level and contractors are working on site.

The incident starts with a call to smoke issuing. On arrival, there is a fire at tenth floor level involving the scaffolding and at least one dwelling at the front of the block. The incident increases in complexity to involve on scene reports of missing persons, fire survival calls, significant fire growth and development compounded by the hazards and risks associated with remedial building works and the risk to life.

Incident Roles

The scenario is designed to move the incident from the first attending appliance with a Crew Manager in charge (IC1) through changes in command (and monitoring) at Watch Manager (IC2), Station Manager (IC3), Group Manager (IC4), Deputy Assistant Commissioner (IC5) and Assistant Commissioner as the final incident commander (IC6). The exercise allows for targeting of specific role or roles and can run in part or full without compromise to the delegate learning outcomes for the role.
