Dear Ms Williams,

We are writing to you on behalf of our members in Grenfell Community Unite who have, to date, asked Rydon not to enter our properties until our concerns about the state of internal works are answered and addressed.

We believe that your threat of the TMO to start investigating legal proceedings against residents in Grenfell Tower is completely unnecessary and disproportionate.

We simply want to have our basic rights as tenants, leaseholders and residents respected by the TMO. We wish nothing more than to request a meeting where our legitimate concerns can be addressed.

We obtained permission in September 2014 from the TMO Resident Engagement Team to form a residents group to discuss the ongoing works, to make sure they took place in a manner and to a quality that all could be proud of. This is an agreement which you have written to us to now refuse.

The members of Grenfell Community Unite would like to meet to discuss with TMO their shared concerns, and to find a way forward to ensure the works are completed in a timely manner. Members also want the TMO and Rydon to display responsibility for the promises made about works in 2014, as this would then allow all us to find a way forward together.

Rather than pursue your threat of legal proceeding we ask you to reconsider your decision not to meet with members of Grenfell Community Unite, so that this matter can be resolved in a expedient and satisfactory manner for all.
