Dear Cllr Coleridge,

I am writing to you regarding the numerous questions and doubts raised in the latest post on the Grenfell Action Group blog which I hope you will already have read by the time you receive this email. You should know that rumour is rife and there is great anxiety among Grenfell Tower residents about whether or not the Council ever intends to follow through by delivering the Grenfell Tower project as promised.

I do not expect you to agree with everything said in the blog post - much of which was highly speculative and intended to inform local residents of detail of which they were almost certainly ignorant, to stimulate informed debate among local residents, and to impress upon you of the need to keep residents properly informed of how the project is progressing (or not), and the need to expedite the planning application with a view to early delivery of this project (as promised).

I would say also that whatever reply you might be inclined to send me in response to this email is of little consequence. What matters most, and what I would earnestly ask you to do, is that you arrange, without further delay, some additional advice and Q&A sessions for the residents of Grenfell Tower, and of the wider Lancaster West community, during which the Grenfell Tower project can be properly discussed, as well as some of the wider funding issues identified in our piece and sourced from Council and TMO documents.
