We the under-signed residents of Grenfell Tower ask the Chairman of the Housing and Property Scrutiny Committee to undertake an urgent scrutiny of the TMO and Rydon's management of the refurbishment project currently underway at Grenfell Tower. Time and again residents' views have been ignored or down played. Despite interventions from our MP Victoria Borwick and our ward councillors, our day-to-day concerns are belittled and sidelined. We understand that the Council will shortly be commencing a major programme of regeneration throughout the borough and that this may involve refurbishment rather than demolition of some other tower blocks.
