You will have seen a number of e-mails sent by the two Leaseholders in Grenfell Tower requesting a meeting. After discussion with Laura Johnson we have confirmed we do not see any requirement for this as they were not using any of our normal processes or meetings with my local staff which we had offered. I attach for information a reply to all the points in their e-mails. We did this as we have had so many e-mails repeating the same thing.

My review confirms we had very little outstanding issues but a lot around their concerns about the gas pipe work which the National Grid (NG) was installing. I am pleased to say that we met with NG yesterday which clarified a number of points around the pipe work which will now be boxed in with fire resistant material therefore complying with any H&S legislations and we will raise this with the Fire Brigade when we have our regular meeting with them this week so this should address all the concerns.

This will be sent to them but we do not copy in all the Councillors across the borough as they do.

I've spoken to Mr Black about this issue and I think it's fair to say we share a frustration about the continual e-mails we and a whole range of councillors continue to receive from Tunde whenever there is a management problem in the block. All of his issues can and are satisfactorily resolved by:

- Reporting repairs and maintenance issues through Repairs Direct or to the housing management office which is located on the estate.
- Resident consultation is undertaken on a range of issues but through the Resident Association which is the correct route not to a self-appointed individual
- Complaints are handled through the complaints process.

What Tunde and Eddie are seeking to achieve is to operate outside these parameters which as you know are put in place to enable an organisation to work effectively on issues across the housing portfolio. They appear to have adopted a strategy of:

- Loud and repeated complaints that shout via e-mail to a large audience to try to shame the TMO into action,
- Repeated requests for public meetings with little stated purpose,
- If they don't like the outcome of a response to a complaint, repeat the first two again until such time as they move onto a new area for dissatisfaction.

Mr Black with come back with the specifics of how the TMO have responded to the complaints Tunde has raised and what the TMO can do to address his dissatisfaction.

I would as you suggest in the interim send a one liner that you are awaiting a briefing from officers and will come back to him as soon as possible.
