Thank you for your email. The notice informing our community that our Right of Way is about to be closed for two weeks explicitly states that the Council have obtained a right to extinguish this route. This claim has now been exposed as an untruth. Please can you, therefore, offer me some explanation as to why the Council are claiming that they have obtained the right to extinguish our long established Right of Way when this is clearly now not the case? Please answer this question directly for me.

I am in the process of contacting the Open Space Society and our advisor at Planning Aid for London to establish what steps the Council need to take to close down our Right of Way and will be back in touch early next week when I am better informed.

Rest assured, our community will not allow the closure of our much loved Right of Way without proper respect being paid to due process and planning law.

Dear Mr Daffarn,

The application to extinguish the right of way across the site has not yet been determined. Following consultation in August, an objection was received from a resident of Whitechurch House to the proposed extinguishment of the right of way over Station Walk. As a result the matter has now been forwarded to the Planning Inspectorate (for the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government) for consideration. We are waiting to learn how the Planning Inspectorate wishes to proceed.

Although I am not aware of the notice you refer to, it is not unusual for rights of way, streets or footways to be temporarily closed in order to carry out repairs or to carry out works to utilities or to adjacent buildings/ lands. The temporary closure is not related to the proposed extinguishment.
