Dear Amy,

As discussed earlier the list of colours below have been looked at extensively with the Planners. The mock-up on site included what we thought were the best candidates (attached jpg).

I was initially hoping for the brushed aluminium, however the Planning Officers preferred the Champagne and Cllr Rock Feilding-Mellen preferred the grey, or "Smoke Silver Metallic". This last would be a reasonable choice. I found it a little too like a battleship grey but Cllr Feilding-Mellen quite liked this comparison when we discussed it.

We put all the available samples out in the sun to arrive at this shortlist. See attached. There was a consensus that the Metallics looked best, given the nature of the existing building and the aspiration for a natural material. The Smoke Silver comes from the standard range. There is a "Brushed Look" range but the closest match, "Stainless Steel Brushed Look" is somewhat darker. We toyed with some exotic alternatives but the steer from the Planners was for neutral tones only.

I hope this is enough.

There may be some scope to delay the order of the aluminium panels but Rydon will need to comment.

The submission was made on 30 June 2014 (+8 weeks = 25 August so you can be sure the pressure is on).

I'm conscious that we already have a number of grey colour samples from yourselves. I would be grateful to know if you are happy for me to put these infront of our Executive Director as an alternative to the Champagne. The samples we have are the following:
