
IN THE GRENFELL TOWER INQUIRY

ORAL OPENING SUBMISSIONS – BRIEF WRITTEN OUTLINE

IMRAN KHAN AND PARTNERS SOLICITORS

We write to provide a concise written skeleton of the planned oral opening submissions for use in the upcoming Grenfell Tower inquiry public hearings.

We intend to make further oral submissions at the inquiry hearings.

We shall address the following issues in the specific context of whether race, religion and/or social class played any part in these matters:

- i. The treatment of residents by the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea in the lead up to and during the period of residency of Grenfell Tower.
- ii. The rationale of the allocation of residents to Grenfell Tower.
- iii. The lived reality of residence in the Tower.
- iv. The presence or otherwise of fire safety measures and the concerns of residents prior to the fire;
- v. The role of the London Fire Brigade and police on the night of the fire, in particular:
 - a. the equipment in use;
 - b. the instructions provided to residents and those involved with the Tower;
 - c. strategic planning and capabilities.
 - d. the treatment of residents and survivors, based upon their race, religion and/or social class.
- vi. The treatment of former residents and bereaved family members post the tragedy, and conduct of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea.

vii. Modification and refurbishment of the Tower and the role of the RBKC and related organisations.
