

What is the Grenfell Tower Inquiry looking at?

On 14 June 2017 a fire broke out at Grenfell Tower in north Kensington which resulted in the devastating loss of lives and homes. The Inquiry will provide answers to the pressing questions of how a disaster of this kind could occur in 21st Century London.

The Terms of Reference set out the scope of the Inquiry. The Inquiry was set up to determine:

- Exactly what happened on 14th June 2017;
- Why it happened?
- What can be done to stop something similar happening again?

The List of Issues intends to set out in greater detail the questions the Inquiry seeks to answer. The List of Issues can be added to or changed as the Inquiry progresses.

The Inquiry is different and separate from the Police Investigation.

What will the Inquiry cover?

In summary, the issues the Grenfell Tower Inquiry will cover are:

- The tower's original design, construction, composition.
- Subsequent modifications prior to the most recent.
- Modifications to the interior of the building 2012-2016.
- Modifications to the exterior of the building 2012-2016.
- The fire and safety measures within the building at the time of the fire.
- Fire, safety and other relevant inspections (including building control inspections).
- Management of the tower.
- Communications with residents.
- Fire advice to residents 2012 to 14 June 2017.
- The response from central and local government to recommendations arising from other fires.
